## Regional Summary for Week 06 (5-11 Feb) & Outlook for Week 07 (12-18 Feb)

- Week 06 was dominated by hydro-meteorological disasters, including floods and landslides in Malaysia, Indonesia and Philippines. All disasters were within the capacity of government agencies of ASEAN member states. Approximately 974,316 people in ASEAN region were affected.
- Alert Status for Mount Agung (Bali, Indonesia) reduced to Alert Level III (Watch) from 10 Feb 2018, with mandatory exclusion zone reduced to 4 km radius ([BNPB](http://bnpb.go.id); [PVMBG](http://pvmbg.go.id)).
- AHA Centre has released [Flash Update 01 for TS Sanba \(Basyang\)](#). Around 2.5 million people are at risk in CARAGA region, Philippines. [PAGASA](#), [DSWD](#) and [NDRRMC](#) are providing warning information and heightening preparedness. TS Sanba may also affect Viet Nam. The [NCHMF](#) provides forecast for Viet Nam and the [VDM/CCDNPC](#) heightens preparedness for TS Sanba.
- Risk of dengue may increase during February 2018 rainy season.
