1	14 Jan – 11 Mar 2018	Philippines, Mayon Volcano Phreatomagmatic Eruption, update 11 Mar 2018 , adinet.ahacentre.org/reports/view/1043 DSWD PHIVOLCS has reduced status of Mayon Volcano to Alert Level 3. Although Mayon Volcano's unrest continues, there is a decreased likelihood of hazardous explosive eruption to occur. Current Permanent Danger Zone is reduced to 6 km radius, with 7 km Extended-Danger Zone • A total of 23,784 families / 91,137 people in 61 Barangays of Albay Province are still affected (increased by 398 people from Week 09) • A total of 1,296 families / 5,017 persons are currently taking temporary shelter in 8 evacuation centers ; while 1,318 families / 5,099 persons evacuated with families/friends • A total of 64 schools in 6-9 Permanent Danger Zone were still affected • A total of PHP 166 million (USD 3.2 million) worth of damages in agriculture sector have been recorded • A total of PHP 472,113,856.43 (USD 9.1 million) worth of assistance has been provided to affected families in Albay Province by DSWD, DOH, OCD, DepEd, DOLE, DENR, PRC, LGUs, I/NGOs, DA, UNFPA, Office of the President, PSCO and DTI

Regional Summary Week 10

- 1) Most disasters recorded in Week 10 were still hydro-meteorological in nature. Floods dominated reports from Indonesia, while storms and strong wind struck Cambodia, Malaysia, Thailand and Viet Nam. No fatalities recorded from these disasters.
- 2) Following the M 5.2 Earthquake in Ranau, Sabah, Malaysia (8 Mar 2018, 21.06 UTC+8), disruptions to climbing activities in Mount Kinabalu occurred and triggered search and rescue operations. Around 239 climbers and workers were safely rescued by local authority.
- 3) In Philippines, preparedness and response activities are still ongoing for Mayon Volcano Eruption, which its status lowered to "Alert Level 3 (from total 5 alert levels) due to decreased likelihood of explosive eruptions ([PHIVOLCS](#)).

- 4) Dry weather conditions continued to prevail over northern part of ASEAN and scattered hotspots with slight to moderate haze were observed in Myanmar (ASMC, 11 Mar 2018). For the next few days, winds are forecast to blow from the east or northeast in the northern ASEAN region, while winds are forecast to blow from the northeast in the southern ASEAN region. ASEAN Specialised Meteorological Centre ([ASMC](#)) increased status to Alert Level 2, indicating more than 150 hotspots detected in 2 consecutive days with dense smoke plumes; dry weather persisting; and prevailing winds blowing towards ASEAN Member States.
- 5) All disasters occurred in Week 10 were within the capacity of respective ASEAN Member States.
