1	14 Jan 2018 – 8 Apr 2018	Philippines, Mayon Volcano Phreatomagmatic Eruption update as of 8 Apr 2018 adinet.ahacentre.org/reports/view/1043 DSWD <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PHIVOLCS maintains Mayon Volcano status at Alert Level 2, referring to the volcano in a moderate level of unrest. Sudden explosions, lava collapses, pyroclastics density currents can still occur and threaten areas in the upper to middle slopes of Mayon. • A total of 23,786 families / 91,055 people in 61 Barangays of Albay Province are still affected. • A total of 96 evacuation centres have been decamped. 21,358 families or 81,556 persons including 2,428 families or 9,499 persons who temporarily stayed with their relatives or friends have returned home • A total PHP 418,450,648.95 (USD 8.03 million) worth of assistance has been provided to affected families by DSWD, local government units and NGOs (increased by around PHP 64 million from Week 12). • List of Barangays under risk in Albany Province

Regional Summary (Week 14)

- 1) Disasters recorded in Week 14 were hydro-meteorological and volcanic in nature with the exception of an oil spill in Indonesia
- 2) Thailand Meteorological Department had issued a summer storm warning for north-eastern and eastern provinces for Week 14. Hailstorm had been recorded in Khon Kaen destroying 107 roofs of houses in the process.
- 3) In Philippines, an earthquake of magnitude 6.0 was felt in Tarragona (Davao Oriental) on 5 Apr 2018. No damage reported, according to [National Disaster Risk Reduction Management Council \(NDRRMC\)](#).
- 4) In Indonesia, Mt Sinabung erupted with a gray smoke column on 6 Apr 2018. [Volcano Observatory Notice for Aviation \(VONA\) is currently RED](#) published on 6 Apr 2018 at 16:26 (UTC+7).
- 5) [ASEAN Specialised Meteorological Centre](#) maintains **Alert Level 2**. some hotspots continued to be observed in Cambodia, Lao PDR, Myanmar, northern Thailand and Vietnam. In southern ASEAN region, there was wet weather conditions but a few hotspots were observed in Peninsula Malaysia and Sumatra.
- 6) All disasters occurred in Week 13 were within the capacity of respective ASEAN Member States.
