Regional Summary (Week 12)

1. Scattered rain showers fell over most of the southern ASEAN region, while dry conditions still persist in most of the Mekong sub-region. The Government of Indonesia's disaster response in Sentani flooding is still ongoing, while Tropical Depression 03W (local name: Chedeng) made landfall in Davao Region in southern Philippines. Transboundary Smoke Haze Alert Level 3 is still raised in the Mekong sub-region for almost two months now. Seismically, the region was relatively calm.
2. The flash flood in Papua Province, Indonesia on 16 March 2019 that affected Sentani District and four other districts resulted to the Provincial Government of Papua issuing a 14-day emergency response period between 16-29 March 2019. The Government response, led by BPBD Papua, were carried out by over 2,300 personnel from 28 institutions and organisations. The disaster level is considered to be moderate.
3. Tropical Depression 03W (local name: Chedeng) weakened into a low pressure area after making landfall in Davao Region. Although it affected a few thousand people and displaced a few number of families, the weather disturbance was actually welcomed by the country because it brought the much needed rain in the area.
4. Seismically, there was a total of only four (4) earthquakes with magnitude 5.0 and above in the region. All of these were recorded in Indonesia ([BMKG](#)). Fortunately, although there was a magnitude 6.3 earthquake in the list, there were no significant impact that could constitute a disaster event.
5. ASEAN Specialised Meteorological Centre ([ASMC](#)) Weather Outlook expects scattered rain showers in the southern ASEAN region and dry conditions in the Mekong sub-region to continue.
6. The reported disasters were within the coping capacity of the respective member states.
