


TYPHOON KAMMURI **PHILIPPINES FLASH UPDATE #2**

Philippines

- According to the latest bulletin by the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA), Typhoon KAMMURI slightly intensifies and is currently located at 155 km East of Juban, Sorsogon (13.0 °N, 125.4 °E) with wind strength of 155 kph. It is moving westward at 15 kph and forecast to make landfall over Albay or Sorsogon province between tonight (2 December) and tomorrow early morning (Tuesday, 3 December).
- Preparedness measures by the government have been implemented, with sufficient stand-by funds and stockpiles as well as facilitating pre-emptive evacuation and conduct of pre-disaster risk assessments and multi-agency meeting/briefing. The National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) maintains its BLUE alert status and declared that situation is still within government capacities.
- As the Typhoon is expected to pass by over the South East Asian (SEA) Games venues in Metro Manila and nearby provinces, the NDRRMC stated that the government is prepared to move the athletes back to their hotels, which will serve as their evacuation centres, and deployed Medical, Incident Management and Quick Response Teams in various SEA Games activity areas.
- The SEA Games organisers likewise assured the public of the following actions in preparation for the coming
 - Presence of contingency plans, which might involve delay, realignment and cancellation of some games, to assure that the staging of the biennial regional sporting meet will have as little disruption as possible:
 - Consulted the Chef de Missions of the participating countries to prepare for the eventuality of resetting some events, as well as to take necessary safety and precautions;
 - On standby to reschedule the flights of athletes and officials when necessary:
 - An alternative plan to move outdoor sports activities to indoors or other safer venues;
 - Sailing and windsurfing events will be held after the typhoon passes;
 - Might consider using the breaks or rest days to adjust possible game delays, but no plan that the Games will go beyond 11 December.
- The AHA Centre National Logistic Officer for the Philippines has already established communication lines with the NDRRMC. The Centre is on stand-by and continuously monitoring the event, and will issue updates should there be any significant development.
