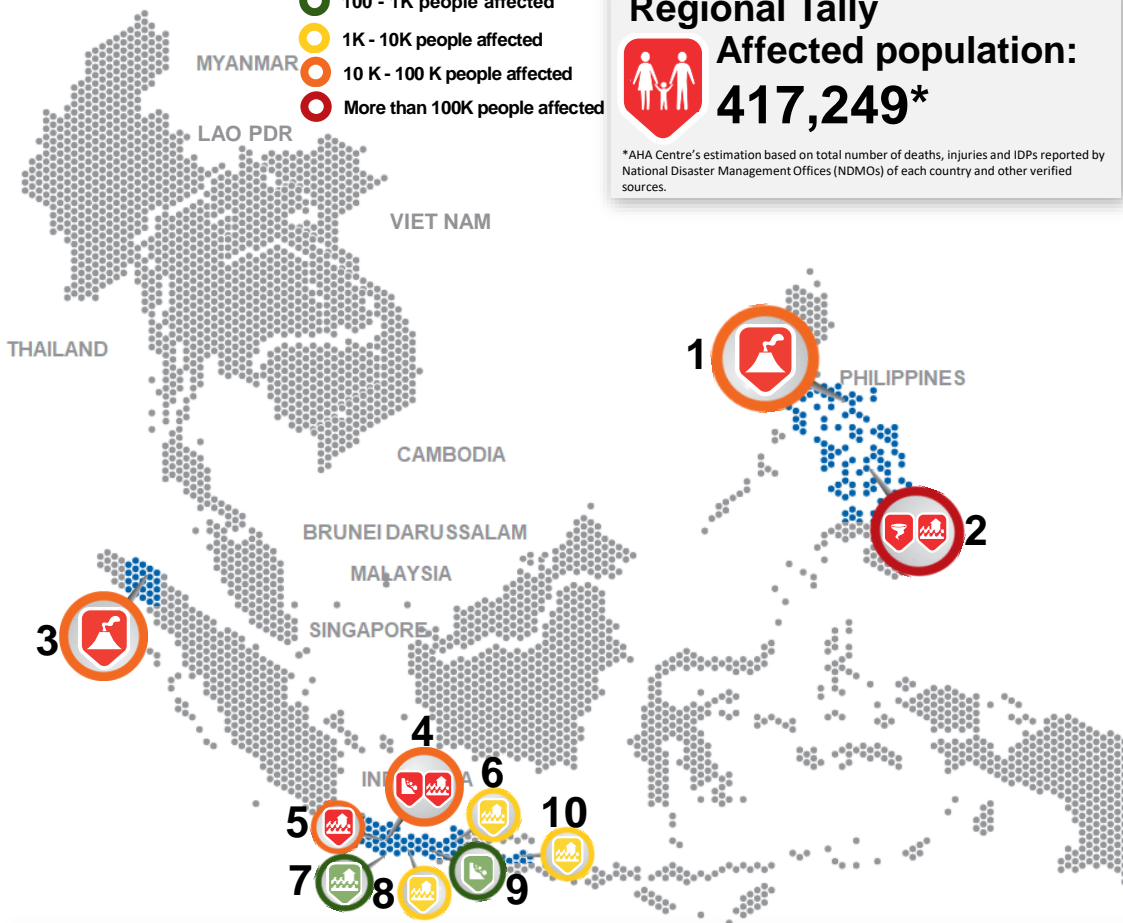

1	14 Jan – 25 Feb 2018	Philippines, Mayon Volcano Phreatomagmatic Eruption update as of 26 Feb 2018 , adinet.ahacentre.org/reports/view/1043 NDRRMC <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mayon's activity was characterized by weak lava fountaining, lava effusion and degassing from the summit crater • PHIVOLCS maintains Alert Level 4 and 8 km radius of Permanent Danger Zone • A total of 23,526 families / 90,148 people in 61 Barangays in Albay Province are still affected (increased by 269 people from Week 07) • A total of 16,106 families or 61,886 persons are currently taking temporary shelter in 57 evacuation center (decreased by 211 people from Week 07) • A total of PHP 431,706,810.83 (USD 8.3 million) worth of assistance has been provided to affected families in Albay Province by DSWD, DOH, OCD, DepEd, DOLE, DENR, PRC, LGUs, I/NGOs, DA, UNFPA, Office of the President and PSCO (an increased by PHP 143million worth of assistance from Week 07).
2	11 – 24 Feb 2018	Philippines, TS Sanba (Basyang) update as of 24 Feb 2018 , adinet.ahacentre.org/reports/view/1060 NDRRMC <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • TS Sanba (Basyang) has caused landslides in six locations, floods in 163 barangays and two capsized boats incidents • A total of 60,687 families / 254,859 people are still affected in 545 barangays in 103 municipalities in 17 Provinces of MIMAROPA, VI, VII, VIII and CARAGA • A total of 8,747 families / 39,326 people are served inside and outside evacuation centres; currently, 3 evacuation centres are still open and served 333 families / 1,405 people • Update on damaged houses: a total of 1,660 houses were damaged (429 totally and 1,231 partially) in Regions VI, VII, VIII and CARAGA • A total of PHP 167,955,031 (USD 3.1 million) worth of damages in agriculture sector in Region VIII have been verified • A total of PHP 11,558,604 worth of assistance was provided by DSWD and LGUs to affected families in Regions VI, VII and CARAGA

Heavy machineries were deployed to improve the situation.

Regional Summary (Week 08)

- 1) Most disasters recorded were hydro-meteorological in nature, with floods and landslides concentrated in Java Island, Indonesia. A major landslide and floods in Brebes Regency caused fatalities, search & rescue efforts still ongoing and caused disruptions to national road and railroad.
- 2) In regards to **M 7.6 Earthquake in Papua New Guinea on 26 Feb 2018** (00:44 UTC+9), there was no casualties and damages reported from Indonesia & Philippines ([BNPB](http://bnpb.go.id) | [NDRRMC](http://ndrrmc.gov.ph)). At present time, strong aftershocks still recorded in Papua New Guinea and felt in Indonesia (Papua).
- 3) In Philippines, preparedness and response activities are still ongoing related to Mount Mayon Phreatomagmatic Eruption and aftermath of TS Sanba (Basyang).
- 4) All disasters are within the capacity of respective ASEAN Member States.
